

MEETING INFORMATION

Finland is very pleased to host the XLV Antarctic Treaty Consultative Meeting (ATCM XLV) and the XXV Meeting of the Committee for the Environmental Protection (CEP XXV). Due to the decision in the ATCM XLIV in Berlin to hold an extra full-day ATCM/CEP joint session on Climate Change on Friday 2 June 2023, the sessions will run from 28 May to 8 June 2023 at the Scandic Marina Congress Center in Helsinki.

Language

XLV Antarctic Treaty Consultative Meeting (ATCM XLV) and the XXV Meeting of the Committee for the Environmental Protection (CEP XXV) will have a simultaneous interpretation available in English, French, Russian and Spanish languages.

MEETING VENUE


ATCM XLV and CEP XXV will be held at Scandic Congress Center Marina, located at Katajanokanlaituri 6, 00160 Helsinki.

Marina Congress Center and the adjacent Grand Marina Hotel offer modern congress facilities, restaurants, bars and accommodation. Marina Congress Center is located by the sea, just a five minute walk from the Senate Square and the Market Square in the heart of Helsinki.

MEETING REGISTRATION

Online registration and meeting documents are managed through the website of the Secretariat of the Antarctic Treaty. The registration process is running until 20 May 2023.

All delegates must be registered to the meeting in order to obtain a badge. A badge is required from all participants to access the meeting venue. The badges contain the delegate's name, organization and a photo. The Registration Desk will be open from 3:00 p.m. to 6.30 p.m. on Saturday 27 May, 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Sunday May 28 and from 8:00 am to 6:00 pm on Monday 29 and Tuesday 30 May. The Registration/Information Desk will be open throughout the event. The badges must be visible throughout the meeting venue and evening program.

FACILITIES AND SERVICES

Additional meeting rooms

There are three additional meeting rooms, which will be available for bilateral and other meetings. One of them is equipped with projectors. Delegates can contact The Host Country Secretariat (HCS) to book the rooms in advance at ATCM-45@formin.fi. In case of ad hoc need for a meeting room during ATCM, please inquire available rooms through the Information Desk.

Business center

Business center is located on the entrance floor, facing the sea front. There you can find basic office supplies, computers and printers for delegates' use.

Catering

The Host Country Secretariat together with the Marina Congress Center are pleased to offer coffee breaks and lunches throughout the conference. The coffee breaks will be held during intervals between sessions twice a day at the entrance level foyer. A light lunch will be provided during 12:30 – 2 pm at the entrance level foyer.

Conference assistants

There are conference assistants and meeting room ushers to assist delegates with any questions. The registration desk/information desk will be open throughout the conference. The meeting room ushers will be able to assist to find correct venues and facilities. You can mark the conference assistants and meeting room ushers with a special name tag "conference assistant". The Ministry for Foreign Affairs will follow guidelines for environmentally sustainable meetings. MFA has incorporated the guidelines into the practical arrangements

of the meetings as well, including meal arrangements, purchases, interior decorating at meeting venues, and transportation/social program.

In Helsinki, MFA together with the local caterers have created special menus that reflect locality, freshness, and seasonal products. We avoid all use of disposable materials and offer all drinks from pitchers rather than plastic bottles.

ARRIVAL & ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Visa requirements

If you need a visa to Finland, apply for a visa from the nearest Finnish mission or the visa centre that the mission advises to you. Honorary consuls and consulates cannot grant visas.

Finland – like the previous host Germany - is a member state of the Schengen agreement and most of the delegations of the ATCM XLV do not need a visa to enter Finland. In some cases, the exemption from the visa requirement applies only to holders of certain kind of passports (for example, diplomatic or biometric). The website of the MFA of Finland provides information by country and the information is available on our Host Country website as well. Please note that one can submit a visa application already six months before arrival.

For those delegations, to whom visa requirement applies, we advise you to contact our Embassies. There are, however, several countries, where we do not have an Embassy. In those cases, <u>Finland is represented by another Schengen country to issue visas for Finland</u>. We shall inform the embassies of our partner countries accordingly. TRANSPORTATION

How to get to the meeting venue

From Helsinki-Vantaa Airport:

Helsinki-Vantaa Airport is located in Vantaa, about 20 km from the meeting venue, Scandic Marina Congress Center. There are several options to get to the city from the airport either by train, bus or taxi. Taxi:

Taxi station are located outside both terminals 1 and 2. A taxi from Helsinki-Vantaa airport to the city and the congress center should cost between 45 and 70 euros (40 to 65 USD). You can pay by cash in euros. All taxis accept all major credit cards.

Public transport:

From the airport, take train I or P to Central Railway Station. The Helsinki Railway Station is located in the city center, approximately 1,5 kilometers from Scandic Grand Marina hotel and congress center. To get to Marina Congress Center and hotel, take tram 4 or 5 towards Katajanokanlaituri from Aleksanterinkatu. NB! Tickets are not sold in trams and trains. At the railway station you can buy a ticket (zones ABC) from a ticket machine for 4,6 euros or you can buy the ticket through the HSL mobile app. The ticket is valid for 80 minutes. When using trams, you can buy a ticket from a ticket machine or by downloading the Helsinki Public Transport (HSL) app.

Getting around the city

Public transportation in Helsinki is safe and easy to use. The Scandic Grand Marina Hotel and Marina Congress Center are situated in the city area called Katajanokka. It is a few hundred meters from the heart of the city center. The easiest means of transportation is the tram. The closest tram stop is located 100 meters from the hotel. The cost of a single public transport ticket for Helsinki (zone AB) is 2,8 €. Tickets can only be bought from a ticket machine or through the Helsinki public transport, HSL, mobile app.

All taxis are metered and accept all major credit cards. Maps and additional information can always be obtained at hotels. Taxis can be ordered by phone, from taxi stands or hailed from the street. Taxi stands are located throughout the city center. Credit cards are accepted in all taxis. Taxi drivers usually speak English. Please note that there are several taxi companies offering transportation. The official taxis are Helsinki Taksi and Lähitaksi.

GENERAL INFORMATION

About Finland

Finland is a Nordic country of 5,5 million inhabitants. The capital is Helsinki, located by the Gulf of Finland in southern Finland. Finland has three neighboring countries: Russia in the east, Sweden in the west and Norway in the north. Finland covers 338,440 km² (131,991 square miles). The distance between the northernmost and southernmost points is 1 157 kilometers.

Finland celebrated 100 years of independence in 2017. Finland is a republic and a parliamentary democracy. Finland became a member of the European Union in 1995. Finland's currency is the Euro.

There are two two official languages: Finnish and Swedish. Finnish is spoken by 87,9 % of the population and Swedish by 5,2 %.

About Helsinki

Welcome to the Capital of Finland, Helsinki! Helsinki is the capital city of Finland and home to 650 000 people. Helsinki is a modern European city of culture that is famous especially for its design and high technology. The city is a pocket-sized metropolis that is easy to discover on foot.

Near the meeting venue, there are several sights to be experienced. You can watch the cruise boats Viking Line and Silja Line arriving to Helsinki and departing to Stockholm. Just a few minutes' walk will take you to the Helsinki Skywheel: and you can take a glimpse of the whole city from above. Next to the Skywheel is Allas Seapool where you can be a true Finn and enjoy Finland's sauna culture, which is adopted to UNESCO cultural heritage list. Right next to the Allas Seapool is the Presidential Palace of Finland and the Market Square. From the Market Square you can take a ferry to Suomenlinna, to enjoy Finnish history and the archipelago at this World Heritage site. Further to the city center by foot, you come to the Esplanade Park and then you are located in the heart of the city and home of all shopping. The biggest and most historical department store Stockmann is at the end of the Esplanade Park.

Business hours

Regular office hours are from Monday to Friday 9 am to 5/6 pm. Most shops are open seven days a week.

Communications

To call Finland from abroad or from an international mobile phone, the international dialing code is +358.

Emergency (police, fire and medical) number: 112

Credit Cards

Major credit cards are widely accepted in all shops and restaurants. Visa, MasterCard, American Express, and Diners Club are the most widely accepted cards. Please remember to save the emergency phone number for any credit card in case it is lost. Please note that almost all transactions by credit card require PIN verification.

Currency and ATMs

The currency in Finland is Euro (€). Retailers do not accept other currencies. Foreign currency can be exchanged at the airport, at banks, and at Forex service points.

Automatic teller machines (ATMs) are widely available and can be used to withdraw euros. The most common one is a yellow ATM machine called "Otto". Many banks impose fees on cash withdrawals, such fees may be higher for international transactions.

Customs

Travelers to Finland are not required to fill in a customs clearance form unless they are bringing an item that needs to be customs cleared. Please visit the web-site of Finnish

Electricity

The standard electricity supply in Finland is 220-240 Volts and the standard frequency is 50 Hz. The power plugs and sockets are of type F. Although some hotels will provide converters and adapters, you are strongly advised to bring your own.

Language

Finland has two official languages, Finnish and Swedish. English is widely spoken.

Medical insurance & medical facilities

All participants are strongly advised to have international health insurance coverage for their stay. All participants are responsible for their own medical expenses.

Public transport

Helsinki has metro, trams, trains and buses. Helsinki metro has a single line. The nearest metro stop to the meeting venue is the University of Helsinki stop. The metro runs from 5.30 am to 11.30 pm from Mondays to Saturdays. On Sundays the metro runs from 6.30 am to 11.30 pm.

Helsinki has a tram system that covers most of central Helsinki. Tramlines 4 and 5 go to Katajanokka, where our meeting venue Marina Congress Center is located. The nearest tram stop to the meeting venue is Kauppiaankatu. To get to the meeting venue, take the tram to direction Katajanokan laituri. The trams run from Monday to Saturday from 5.30am to 11.30pm. On Sundays the trams run from 7am to 11.30am.

All taxes are included in the marked prices in department stores, restaurants and hotels.

Time

Helsinki standard time is GMT +2 hours.

Tipping

Tipping is not required in restaurants, bars or taxis.

Water

Tap water is safe to drink everywhere Finland. You can drink water from any tap unless clearly indicated otherwise. Please use the reusable water bottle provided to you by the Host Country Secretariat and enjoy Finnish tap water.

Weather

Finland has a much milder climate than most other regions of the world that lie as far north. Although the average temperature in Helsinki in May is only 12°C and 14°C in June, the daily temperatures may vary significantly in late May and early June.
