Finland has increased its support for Ukraine owing to the country's difficult political, economic and humanitarian situation. During the conflict in 2014-19 Finland's support to Ukraine in the form of projects, funding international organisations, humanitarian aid and expert secondments has been nearly **47 million euros**. In addition, support to Ukraine has been given through the EU, IMF and World Bank.

In 2018-22 Finland continues bilateral assistance to Ukraine by supporting Ukraine's **school reform** with 8 million euros (of which 2 million € funded by EU). Through a Trust Fund established at NEFCO (Nordic Environment Finance Corporation) Finland supports Ukraine's **energy efficiency, renewable energy and alternative type of energy sources** with 6 million euros during 2018-21.

In 2018 Finland supported projects in Ukraine with **3.4 million euros**. In addition, Finland financed expert secondments worth of **3.1 million euros**. In 2017 Finland provided around **4.1 million euros** worth of new funding in assistance to Ukraine. In addition, the cost of expert secondments in 2017 was **3.4 million euros**. In 2016 Finland provided around **2.5 million euros** worth of project and humanitarian aid funding to Ukraine. In addition, the cost of expert secondments in 2016 was **3.3 million euros**. Finland's support to Ukraine in 2015 totalled **7.9 million euros** in projects and humanitarian aid as well as around **3.3 million euros** in expert secondment costs. In 2014 Finland allocated **6.5 million euros** in projects and humanitarian aid and **1.5 million**



euros in expert secondment costs. Finland has dispatched, among others, OSCE observers, border control experts and election observers, as well as anti-corruption and administrative reform experts, to Ukraine.

For **humanitarian mine action** Finland has allocated 1.5 million euros. Of this sum 1 million euros was directed to HALO organisation's community-centred clearance programme in 2017-2018, and 0.5 million euros to ICRC for 2016-2020 for medical services and land mine clearance. ICRC also supports through financial assistance two **physical rehabilitation centers** to provide disabled people with good-quality prosthetic/orthotic devices and physiotherapy free of charge. ICRC provides the centers also with technical support and training for strengthening their institutional and operational capacities.

In 2015 Finland allocated 4 million euros for **rebuilding assistance**. Out of this assistance 2.75 million euros were allocated to a prefabricated school building that was commissioned by NEFCO and 0.75 million to the NEFCO's Nordic Energy Efficiency and Humanitarian Support Initiative. In addition, Finland granted 0.5 million euros to support the **Council of Europe's** Action Plan 2018-2021, 0.5 million euros for Action Plan 2015-2017, and 150.000 euros in 2014-15 for the CoE's work in support of Ukraine's constitutional reforms. There is currently one **gender specialist** financed by Finland at the Council of Europe's office in Kiev.

Finland has granted a total of 4.6 million euros in **humanitarian aid** for Ukraine. This year Finland granted 0.7 million euros to ICRC through Finnish Red Cross. In 2017 Finland granted 0.9 million and in 2016 0.5 million euros to the Finnish Red Cross. In 2015 Finland allocated total 1.5 million euros through World Health Organisation, UN refugee agency (UNHCR) and International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies. In 2014 Finland granted 0.5 million euros to the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) and 0.5 million euros to UNHCR. In 2015 the Ministry of the Interior of Finland donated 0.3 million euros worth of winter-use tents for humanitarian purposes. The humanitarian assistance has been used to support civilians suffering from the conflict in East Ukraine.

Finland supported the activities of the **OSCE Special Monitoring Mission** to Ukraine by granting 2 million euros in voluntary extra-budgetary contribution in 2014 as well as paying through the OSCE budget 0.1 million euros in 2014, 1.2 million euros in 2015 and 1.4 million in 2016 and 2017, 1.3 million in 2018 and 1.5 million in 2019. At the moment there are 25 observers seconded by Finland.

Further, Finland has participated in the **OSCE border observer mission**. At the moment there is one Finnish observer in the mission. In 2019 Finland will support **OSCE Office for Democratic Institutions and Human Rights** (ODIHR) dialogue project with 200.000 euros. In 2018 Finland contributed 200.000 euros for **OSCE High Commissioner on National Minorities**, in addition to previous support of 100.000 in 2015. In 2017 Finland supported the project of **OSCE Representative on Freedom of the Media** with 100.000 euros. In 2015 Finland funded ODIHR dialogue project with 0.1 million euros, OSCE Anti-Corruption Interactive Training Programme for Border Guards, Customs Services and Anti-Corruption Authorities of Moldova and Ukraine with 50.000 euros, and OSCE Project Co-ordinator in Ukraine with 33.800 euros.

Finland takes part in the **European Union's civilian crisis management missions** EUAM (EU Advisory Mission) Ukraine and EUBAM (EU Border Assistance Mission) Moldova and Ukraine by sending personnel. At the moment there are six Finnish experts working at EUAM and one expert working for EUBAM. EUAM Ukraine supports the development of the civilian security sector in Ukraine. EUBAM Moldova and Ukraine supports the monitoring of the border between the two countries.

During 2017 – April 2018 one **UN Youth Volunteer** financed by Finland was working at UN Women Kiev office.

Through the multilateral stability and sustainable growth fund for Ukraine of the **European Bank for Reconstruction and Development (EBRD)**, Finland has granted 1.5 million euros. The EBRD fund supports the

reform of Ukraine's governance as well as strengthens the operational preconditions for the private sector and SME sized enterprises, the banking sector, energy efficiency and municipal services. The main operations are support for the National Reform Council's work as well as support for Ukraine's first Business Ombudsman's office.

The **Energy Efficiency and Environment Partnership Fund (E5P)** aims to develop district heating and improve energy efficiency in Ukraine. Finland supported this Fund with a total of 2 million euros in 2010–2014.

Through the **World Bank's International Finance Corporation (IFC)**, Finland supported development of environment-friendly clean production in agriculture by a total of 1.6 million euros during the years 2010–2015. In addition, Finland supported **World Bank's District Heating project** in 2016 by financing implementation support for investments with 135.300 euros.

Finland granted the sum of 275.000 euros in 2015 and 340.000 euros in 2014 for the financing of the **Nuclear Smuggling Outreach Initiative**. The programme improves the capacity of Ukrainian border crossing points to prevent the smuggling of nuclear material and radioactive material. The project is concentrated on the border between Ukraine and Moldova.

The project of the **international non-governmental organization PATRIR** (Peace Action, Training and Research Institute of Romania) to support conflict prevention skills and the launching of multilingual education received 1.5 million euros in support from Finland for the years 2009–2015. At the beginning the project was implemented in Crimea and later on in other parts of Ukraine.

Finland has granted annually approximately 100.000 – 150.000 euros in **appropriations for local cooperation projects** that are managed by the Embassy of Finland in Kyiv. The appropriations are focused on Ukrainian non-governmental organizations.

In 2018, Finland supports two **civil society organisations'** projects in Ukraine: with 275.000 euros **CMI's (Crisis Management Initiative)** project related to Ukraine's peace process, and with 20.000 euros Abilis foundation's project for capacity building of disabled peoples organisations and income generation of people with disabilities. In 2014, Finland supported with almost 11.000 euros the **Abilis foundation** project to found a "Perspektiva" rehabilitation center, which gives social, psychological and employment assistance. In 2014, Finland awarded a total of 50.000 euros for activities to develop Roma villages carried out by the **Finnish NGO Elämä ja Valo ry**.

Finland funded in 2015-2016 with almost 375.000 euros two **CMI's projects supporting to find a solution to the conflict in Ukraine**. The other project focuses on high-level dialogue between Ukrainian and Russian experts and the other project works with negotiators engaged in the official Trilateral Contact Group subgroups.

In 2018 Finland supported **NATO's Professional Development Programme** with 20.000 euros and NATO's Trust Fund **EOD and C-IED project** with 40.000 euros. In 2015-2017, Finland contributed total 170.000 euros to **NATO's medical rehabilitation in Ukraine and Building Integrity Trust Funds** respectively. The aim is to support practical cooperation with Ukraine in the area of medical rehabilitation, to reduce corruption in the armed forces and to develop defence organizations in partner countries, including in Ukraine. In 2014, Finland granted 40.000 euros for the **Ukraine II Trust Fund** which supports the destruction of SALW, ammunitions and land mines.
