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Context - Ireland's ODA (2023)

- Total ODA, excluding In-Donor Refugee Costs €1.47 billion, representing 0.38% of GNI.
- International Development Programme (D/Foreign Affairs managed) c €0.7 million
- Balance is managed by other Departments and includes our contribution to the EU
 Development Budget
- Ireland's Development Policy *A Better World* (2019) 4 pillars Reduce humanitarian need, » promote gender equality, » strengthen governance, and » support climate action



Mission Strategies (1)

- Over 100 Missions globally (expansion by 25 under the Global Ireland Strategy since 2018)
- 12 'Partner' Countries annual budget c. €200m (range €5m €32m); 5-year cycles
- Formerly known as Country programmes, but now cover full spectrum of foreign policy political, trade, culture, citizens services, development
- Outcome/outputs focused linked to Policy Priorities
- Emphasis on Influencing (but not monitored/structured in a systematic way)



Evaluation and Learning

- Mid-Term Reviews and Ex-post Evaluation of all Mission Strategies
- Individual Mission approach to evaluation (unlike Finland, not meta/synthesis)
- Utility inform next strategy cycle + Accountability and learning NB
- Using OECD Evaluation Criteria Coherence and Effectiveness
- Reviewing approach to Mission Strategy Evaluation (Scope breadth v depth)



Some Observations on Meta Analysis

- CPs have delivered results
- CPs have strengthened continuity and Results-based Management
- CPs need to reflect realities on the ground....required unrealistic level of effort
- Importance of pro-active planning for sustainability of results and resilience
