These were conducted in Kiswahili and Nepali:

- Tanzania (TZ) $n=54$ of which 76% female (an added 5 pilot interviews were conducted using the same questionnaire in Dar es Salaam, but not included in this presentation)
- Nepal (NEP) $n=31$ of which 81% from district level, *Rautahat* (94% male). Furthermore we collected 10 online (88% male) responses as a reference point

In Finland (FI) $n=22$ (online questionnaire), of which 77% female. The population ($n=96$), collected from documents provided by DEMO Finland HQ (23% response rate).
